HOMEOWNERS' MEETING SUMMARY

BUDGET RATIFICATION/ROOF DISCUSSION

11/30/23

Many thanks to everyone who attended the 11/30/23 Crosspointe Homeowners' Meeting. We had a strong turnout and appreciated the good questions homeowners asked. Below are some brief highlights from the meeting:

Budget Ratification

- Sally Goodfellow presided over the budget ratification process and explained the purpose of budget ratification, i.e., the Board approves the budget and the homeowners give their consent.
- Crosspointe homeowners consented to the 2024 budget
- Larry Townley gave a brief overview of the 2024 budget, e.g.,
 - o a 2.4 increase in monthly assessments for 2024 (\$8.00),
 - o an increase in master association dues to Highland Creek,
 - o a change to the reserve allocation for roofs.
- Homeowners participated in a Q&A to clarify their understanding of the budget

Roof Discussion

- JoAnn Haveland talked about why Crosspointe is doing roof replacements now
 - Our homes are aging
 - The 2016/2017 Reserve Study indicated that our roofs will need replacing in 2022-2023
 - The has been an appreciable increase in roof leaks over the last two years
- Thompson Lester from the Ad Hoc Roofing Committee (Thompson Lester, Becky Bjork, Jennifer Lester) presented the results of the committee's work over the summer
 - The committee got smart about roofs, e.g., conducted online research, talked with roofers, scrutinized the Reserve Study
 - Reviewed 18 local roofing contractors
 - Submitted Report to the Board
 - Thompson elaborated about what they learned regarding shingles, gutters/downspouts, roof components and fail points, and current damage/insurance.
- JoAnn ended the presentation by talking about where we are today
 - Request for Proposals sent to six roofing contractors on 11/17/23

- o Proposals to be submitted by 12/8/23
- o Bids to be evaluated by Evaluation Team
- Selection made by 1/8/23, barring any unforeseen circumstances
- Homeowners had an opportunity to ask questions and clarify their understanding about the roof replacement project.

Next Steps:

- Exploring funding for the project current reserves are not enough to cover cost of replacements
- Next homeowners' meeting scheduled for January 23, 2024
 - New contractor will be present to answer questions
 - Special assessments will be discussed
- Voting for the special assessment will take place by paper ballot sent through the mail. 67% of homeowners will need to vote yes in order to move forward with replacements. This is approximately 88 of 131 homeowners.
